Dear Families:

As we work through the COVID-19 pandemic, St. Stephens Indian School continues to work with the Wyoming Department of Education (WDE), the Bureau of Indian Education (BIE), our local and state Public Health officials, and other entities to gather up-to-date information to provide to our community.

With information from the Governor, WDE, BIE, and Fremont County Public Health officer, Brian Gee St. Stephens Administration and Board of Trustees has determined that, at this time, a return to school on April 6th is not feasible or in the best interest of the health of our students, staff, families, or community at large. The safety and health of our students, staff, families, and the community is priority at this time. St. Stephens Indian School has been closed indefinitely, but we plan to monitor the situation and keep in contact with the appropriate entities to determine the best time to return to school. We will keep you updated as future decisions are made.

We have created an adapted learning plan, in accordance with the WDE and BIE that includes online education, as well as work being delivered to homes. As this plan is developed further, and finalized, we will share it with you. One thing that is important to remember, beginning April 6th, students will be sequined to complete work that is work home or reversibed online. This work will directly affect the
